In 2022, we had plans to develop our projects and initiate new ones in the fields of ecology, children's assistance, and more. However, the events of February 24th halted almost all the work we had started. We managed to react quickly to the situation, and in the early days of the war, we launched the "Ukraine War Help Center" project. Within this framework, we began providing aid to internally displaced families, people fleeing the war, the Armed Forces of Ukraine, hospitals, and the people living in active conflict zones such as Kyiv, Chernihiv, Kharkiv, Kherson regions, and others. Initially, there was a lot of chaos, but we had two important goals – to maintain control and the team.

As time passed, we quickly learned to work in conditions of war. We adapted to the needs and started building not only tactical but also strategic goals. Thus, we were able to support not only the military and civilian population but also provide hospitals with valuable medical equipment that helps save lives. We also supported institutions that care for animals, such as animal shelters and zoos in Kyiv, Kharkiv, and Mykolaiv regions, which were on the verge of survival.

We sincerely thank all our partners and donors for their contributions because, without you, friends, we would never have been so helpful. We are confident in Ukraine's victory. We clearly feel that we are in the right place at the right time!

Despite the fact that most of the Foundation's resources are directed towards implementing the "Ukraine War Help Center" project, we tried not to forget about our other directions. In May and June, we resumed projects to support seriously ill children, public and charitable organizations.

This year became the most challenging year of our lives and the biggest professional challenge, but still, we welcomed 2023 with hope in our hearts! Throughout this year of the war, our team underwent a significant transformation. We became strong, confident, and we know for sure that superheroes do not live in movies but in Ukraine, and many of them we know personally.

HELP CENTER

After the start of the full-scale war by russia against Ukraine, we created a separate response program called the "Ukraine war help center," which operates in **4 main directions:**



Aid to internally displaced families living in shelters, addressing urgent humanitarian issues in besieged cities, assistance to Points of invincibility;



Supplying essential goods, tactical and protective equipment to the Armed Forces of Ukraine and territorial defense units.



Provision and support of medical institutions throughout the territory of Ukraine



Assistance to Ukrainian charitable and public organizations actively involved in aid projects.

Within the program, we collaborate with local and district authorities, representatives of regional military administrations, NGOs, and territorial communities. The main beneficiaries of the program are Ukrainian citizens who have suffered as a result of military aggression, those forced to change their place of residence, individuals who have been injured due to military actions or rocket attacks, soldiers of the Armed Forces of Ukraine and territorial defense units, as well as medical professionals and representatives of the healthcare sector.



In 2022, we implemented 35 aid projects worth 14,000,000 UAH together, providing 8 hospitals in Izyum, Balaklia, Nikopol, Kherson, Novovorontsovsk, and Kyiv with the necessary medical equipment.

People affected by the war and internally displaced persons received essential help. We also paid for the treatment of military personnel, supported zoos in Kharkiv and Mykolaiv, an animal shelter in Gostomel, etc.

PURCHASE OF DRONES WITH CITY 24

The City24 company is a long-time friend and partner of our foundation. In 2022, we implemented many joint projects, namely aimed at the treatment of seriously ill children, targeted assistance to zoos that were on the verge of survival since the beginning of the war, assistance to military personnel and internally displaced persons, as well as a large joint project "10 Drones" in the framework of which 14 military units received modern drones. In 2022, together we purchased 9 drones and another 6 at the beginning of 2023 for a total of about 1,700,000 UAH.* Also, the focus of our attention fell on the purchase of Starlinks and the air defense modernization complex - "Vual".

PURCHASE OF GENERATORS

WITH EASY PAY

Thanks to an active partnership with the Easy Pay company, in 2022 we focused on helping the Armed Forces, shelters and healthcare facilities.

In **2022**, we managed to purchase and deliver **65 units of heaters**, **portable power plants**, **power banks**, **and generators** for a total amount of **835,293 UAH**.

At the beginning of **2023**, **4 generators** worth **374,000 UAH** have already been purchased and handed over. In the future, within the framework of joint projects, we will focus on the purchase of technical means.

DESCRIPTION OF OUR WORK IN

OTHER PROJECTS

One of the priority tasks of our Foundation has always been the support of seriously ill children. But with the beginning of a full-scale war, most of the resources of our organization were used for the implementation of the "Ukraine war help center" project. Most of our wards went abroad with their families. But not considering all the circumstances, we continued to provide assistance to those who needed it in Ukraine.

Thus, in 2022, 5 children received expensive hearing aids, 8 children with cancer received medication, and 9 children diagnosed with cerebral palsy, autism, and Down syndrome were paid for treatment in rehabilitation clinics.

A total of 1,000,000 UAH was spent on the needs of the children's aid program.

We also supported and helped animals, and therefore a little more than 1,000,000 UAH was spent as part of

the "My Friend" program to support animals in shelters and zoos in Kharkiv, Kyiv, and other cities.




