It is these principles that help us move forward and scale our support.

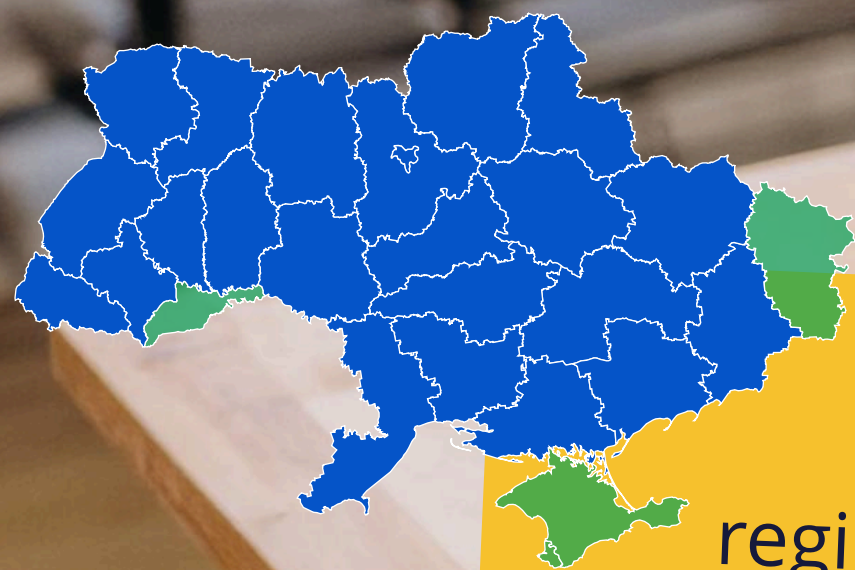
Behind every project and delivered aid are people, processes, and a lot of unseen work that we do every day.

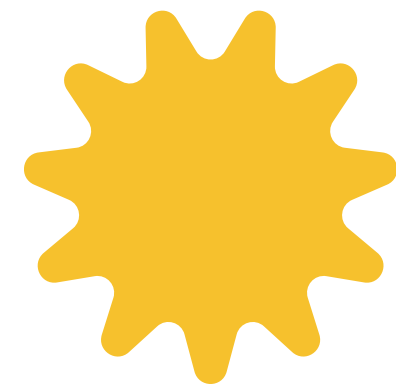

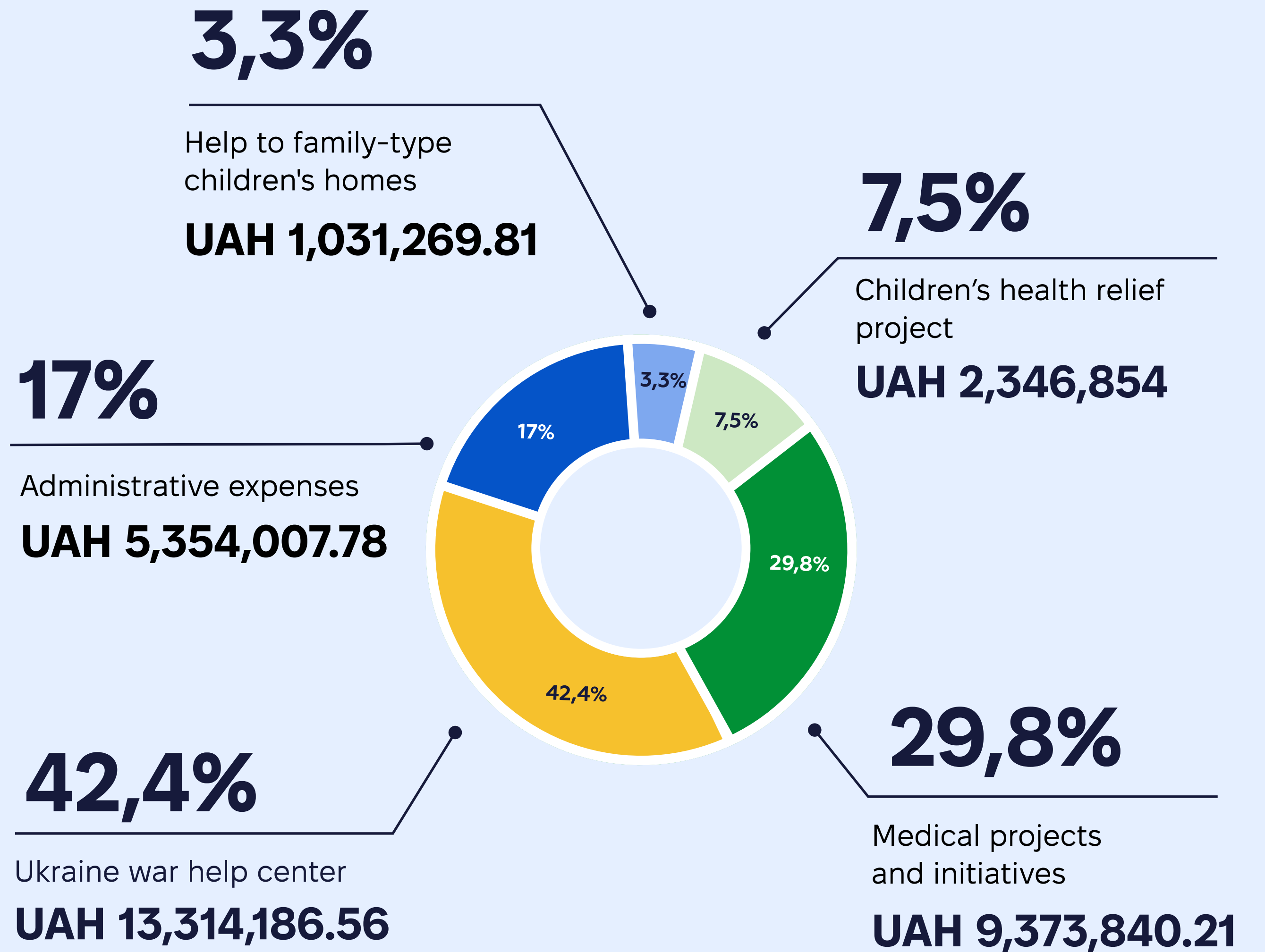

# Medical projects and initiatives

For many years, **we have been supporting public hospitals:** delivering modern medical equipment and organizing training for medical specialists so that they have the necessary resources and knowledge to provide quality care to patients.

## The main areas of our work:



**Rehabilitation** — supporting institutions that help people regain mobility and independence



**Women's health** — providing equipment for gynecological and maternity wards



**Children's health** — supporting hospitals that treat children, including those affected by the war



**Frontline hospitals** — assisting medical facilities operating in difficult and dangerous conditions

Due to the cancellation of the centralized procurement of the drug "Cytarabine," children undergoing cancer treatment were left without life-saving medicine.

The foundation team promptly responded to the hospital's request and supplied the department with the drug. This allowed treatment to continue without interruption and protected families from difficult financial decisions.

## A new milestone: Supporting the Maria Pokrova School

In 2025, we also launched a project to support the **Maria Pokrova Lviv Special School** — the oldest educational institution in Ukraine for children with hearing impairments.

Around **80 children** study here, with specialists working daily to develop their speech, communication, and cognitive skills.

We believe that learning should be engaging. To achieve this, we delivered essential educational and correctional materials to the school for: STEM education, sensory integration, and developmental correction activities.

# Doing good together with dobro.ua



We have been partnering with the **dobro.ua** platform for many years, running joint fundraising campaigns and, together with donors, supporting those who need it most.

In **2025**, thanks to caring donors, we managed to achieve a great deal. We delivered hearing aids to children, covered the costs of rehabilitation courses, supported residents of Sumy Region with bread, purchased hospital equipment, and funded English courses for children — and this is only a part of what we accomplished together.

# Partnership with GlobalGiving



We have been partnering with **GlobalGiving** since **2022** and deeply value this consistency and trust. It is thanks to this support that we are able to **implement systemic projects and long-term changes.**

In **2025**, we received grant funding of **USD 250,000.00** to implement the 13-month project "**Rehabilitation: New Life**," aimed at supporting medical institutions providing rehabilitation services to those affected by the war in Ukraine.

In 2025, together with UkrGasbank, we implemented a series of initiatives to support the Defense Forces of Ukraine and the families of service members.

# Together with EasyPay: From support to action



Our partnership with **EasyPay** has been going on for many years — and in **2025**, we continued to implement joint initiatives.

Together, we support children, family-type children's homes, and our defenders. We deeply value this flexibility, openness to new ideas, and readiness to respond quickly wherever help is needed most.

In addition, in **2025**, the **EasyPay** team joined our initiative and **became Secret St. Nicholases for children from the Sumy Region** — providing a very special, heartfelt, and deeply personal kind of support.



Together with **EasyPay**, **Arthouse Traffic**, and the **SICH company**, we purchased and delivered **400 tourniquets to State Emergency Service medics** in Odesa.

These tourniquets have helped SES medics act faster and more effectively — because in situations involving critical bleeding, every second counts.

The initiative was launched as part of the premiere of the film "**2000 Meters to Andriivka**" to raise awareness and support those who save lives every day.



# Children's events: Delivering the joy they need today

Nearly all of our aid programs focus on children in one way or another. Alongside systemic support, we strive to preserve the most essential thing for them — the feeling of childhood.

In **2025**, our organization successfully passed the verification process on the **Philanthropy in Ukraine platform**. Independent experts analyzed our activities, documentation, governance transparency, and reporting. Based on the evaluation results, we scored 3 out of 4 possible points.

**Philanthropy in Ukraine** serves as a reliable bridge between donors and charitable organizations, and we are proud to be among the vetted foundations driving real change.

This verification opens up more opportunities for partnerships and attracting support, enabling us to continue implementing our programs.

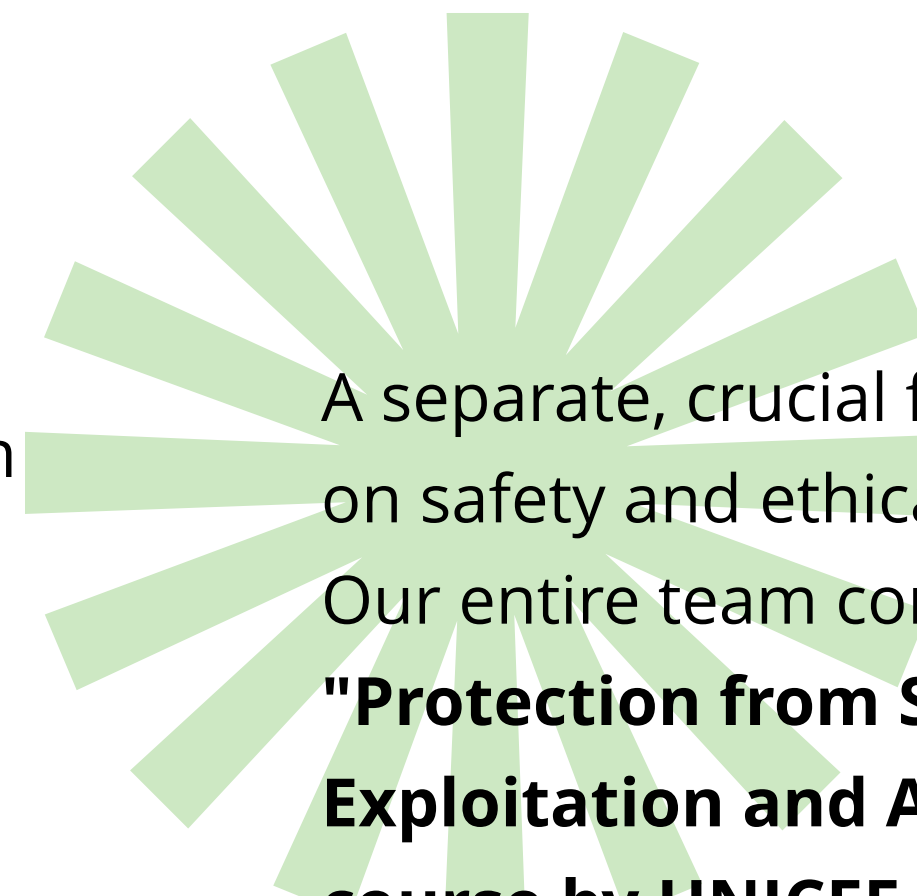
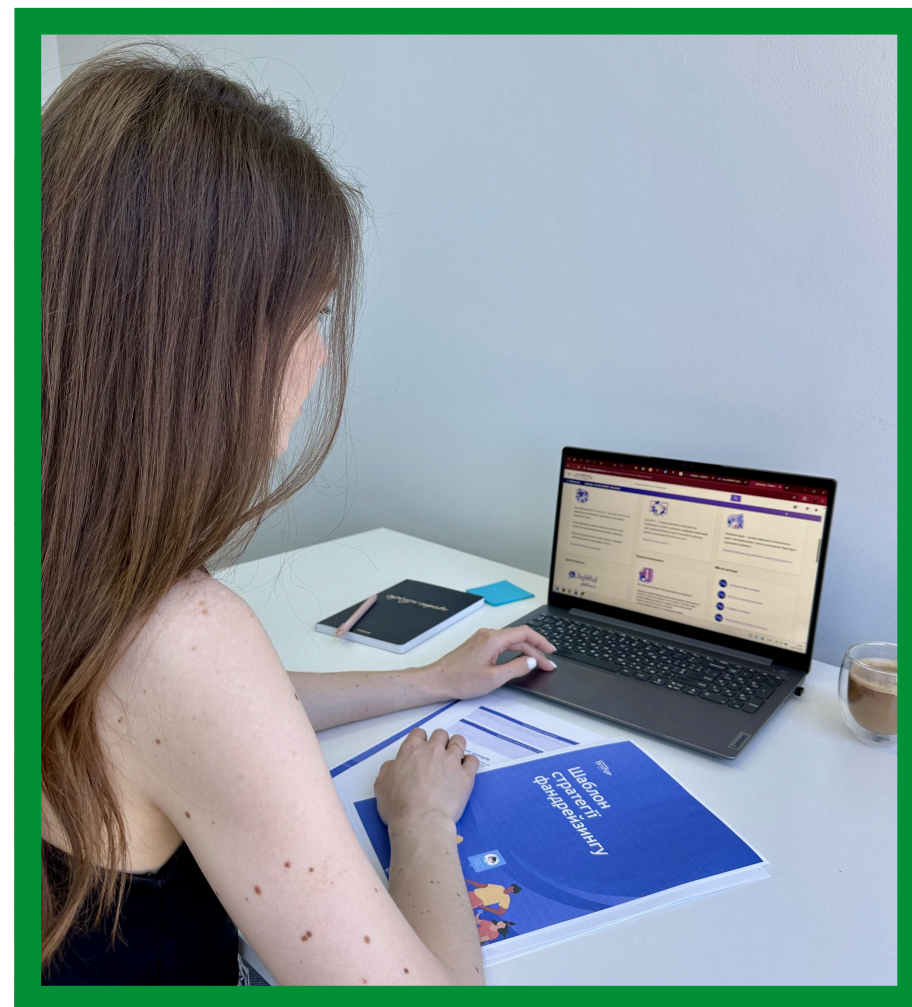

# Enhancing organizational capacity

Learning is an integral part of our work and development. In **2025**, we focused heavily on capacity building to become even more effective and resilient.

Our entire team completed training in the **BRIDGE Advanced program by Lightful**, which helped us rethink our strategic approaches, communications, and digital development.

We also participated in professional conferences, workshops, and webinars, where we exchanged experiences with colleagues and strengthened our expertise in fundraising, partnerships, and strategic development.



A separate, crucial focus was placed on safety and ethical work standards. Our entire team completed the **"Protection from Sexual Exploitation and Abuse" (PSEA) course by UNICEF**. We also updated our internal policies and response mechanisms to ensure these standards live in our daily work, not just on paper.

Exploring new approaches, updating knowledge, sharing experiences, and improving internal processes form the foundation for a modern charitable foundation team.

# Geography of aid: Where we implemented projects in 2025

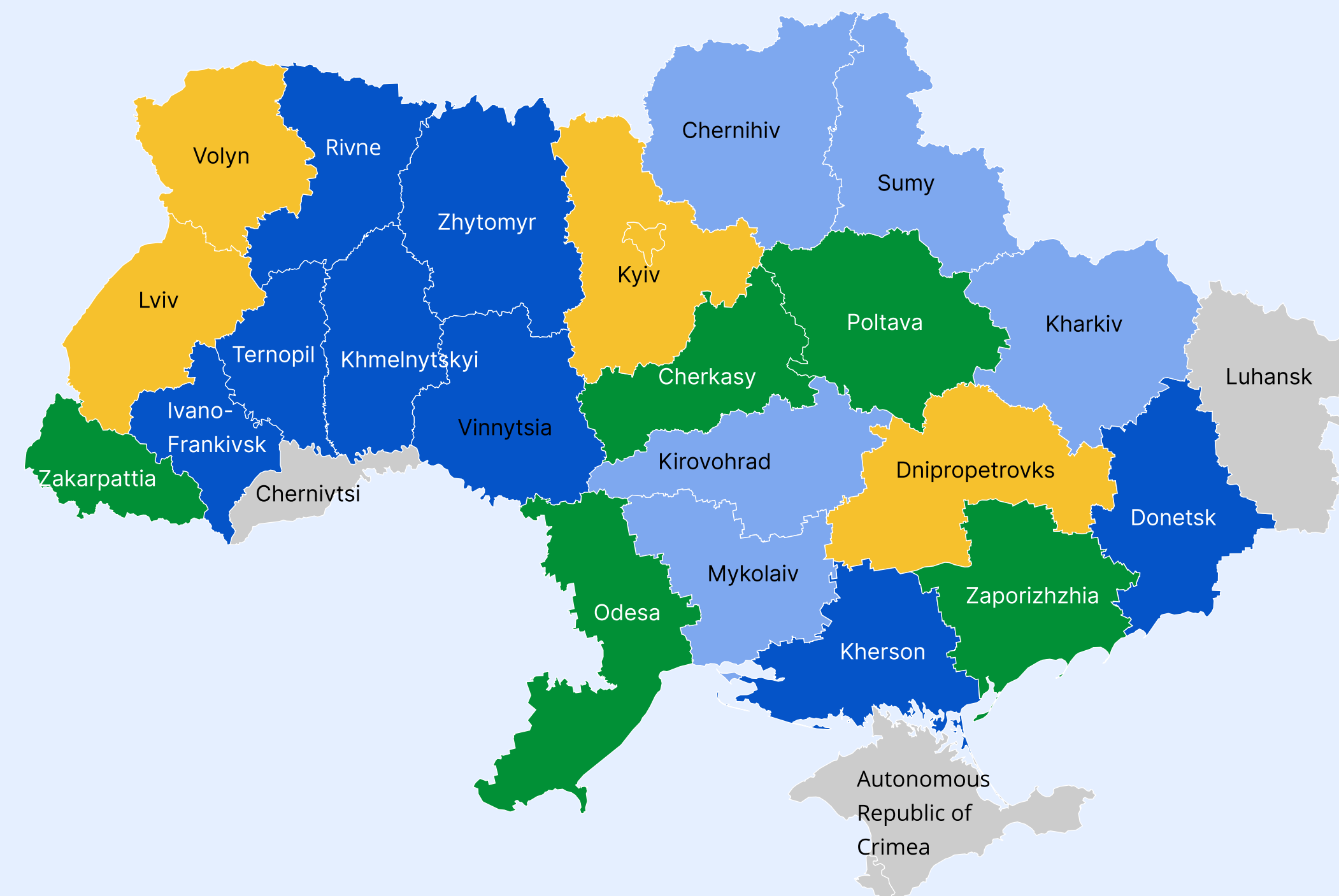
Our work cannot be measured by report figures alone. We talk about numbers and measure our results — but behind every statistic, there are real people and human stories.

**P.S. Thank you to the team for making every "impossible" deadline possible, and for your ability to turn "difficult" into "done" every day.** I am proud of us and of our work.



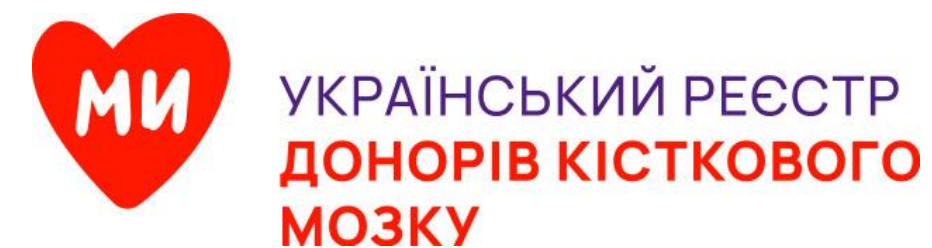

In **December 2025**, we launched a grant project supported by the **UNDP**, aimed at improving rehabilitation services in the Zakarpattia region. In 2026, we are actively implementing it and working systematically to strengthen this area.

# Message from the Chair of the Supervisory Board

The war continues to change the lives of people, communities, hospitals, families, and children. At the same time, it is changing the charity sector: needs are growing, while resources are shrinking. We see donor potential declining as the economic situation worsens. But that is exactly why everyone's contribution becomes even more vital. **In charity, there is no such thing as a "small" effort if it is backed by real action.**

In **2025**, the team of the "**Social Projects Center of Future**" continued to focus on several **key areas: supporting medical institutions and physical rehabilitation programs, helping children with severe illnesses, supporting foster families, aiding the Defense Forces of Ukraine, and cooperating with local initiatives and partners.** Behind every number in this report are people who received a chance for treatment, recovery, education, safety, or simply the feeling that they were not left alone.

In **2026**, the foundation is entering a phase of deeper **digital transformation in fundraising and reporting** to make our processes clearer, faster, more transparent, and convenient for donors, partners, and the people we help. **I am deeply grateful to all our partners — especially GlobalGiving, Vodafone Ukraine, city24, EasyPay, Ukrposhta, and others — as well as to our foundation team, donors, volunteers, and everyone who stood by us in 2025.** In 2026, we will continue to work calmly, responsibly, openly, and with faith in victory.
